

Financial Aid Process for International Students

Students who do not meet the required US citizenship status in order to qualify for federal aid, may review the following financial aid options:

- If you are a J.D. student, you can complete the International JD Student Financial Aid Application on the <u>Cardozo Office of Student Finance Financial Forms website</u> each academic year. Please note - LL.M. students are <u>not</u> eligible to complete this institutional application
- Once the Office of Student Finance receives your International JD Student Financial Aid Application, your application will be reviewed to determine your eligibility for the following:
 - Need- based Cardozo grants and/or
 - Need- based Cardozo loans
- If you are a **LL.M. student**, you may want to consider the following options:
 - Financial assistance from your home country
 - A U.S. private loan (which may require you to have a U.S. citizen as a co-signer
 - An institutional tuition <u>payment plan</u> through Cardozo
